



### Incredible Edibles is coming to Long Sault

Organized by Transition Cornwall+ Food Action Group, this event which has been giving away free vegetable plants for thirteen years in Cornwall is now happening here, at Christ Church car park, Saturday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, 11 am to 1 pm.

We are a group that wants to encourage people to begin growing their own food and enjoy local produce. With that in mind, over 3,000 plants are grown by volunteers in our area including those in Long Sault or donated by local professional growers. A large number are offered and taken by not for profit organizations for their clients and residents and the rest we give to the public at specific giveaway sites – two per person or four per family. The list of vegetables is long: from patio tomatoes, peppers, bush beans to basil and parsley. This year, as well as in Long Sault there will be plants in Cornwall at the Agape Centre, St. Theresa Park and Mattice Park.

As we want to reach out to people who do not have gardens, we repot many vegetable seedlings in large permanent pots so people can put them on balconies, front doorsteps or window sills and still have the pleasure of growing and eating their own food. Other plants are in small pots for replanting into gardens.

If you are new to gardening, don't worry, as at each site including the Christ Church carpark, we will have experienced gardeners who can answers your questions and offer planting and maintenance advice.

This annual event is made possible by our volunteers, the City of Cornwall, Marlin's Orchards, Cornerstone Organics, Kinsmen Farmers Market, Long Sault Christ Church, Knox St. Paul, and Agape.

Transition Cornwall+ Food Action Group is a working group with the Social Development Council of Cornwall and Area.


